Newport Night Shelter 2018—2019

During the coldest winter months, a group of Newport churches open their doors and hearts to welcome in the city's homeless from the streets. We provide a hot supper and drinks, a warm, safe bed for the night, toiletries, breakfast in the morning, and genuine friendship.

Night shelter 2018-19 is up and running.

We are excited once again to be able to provide emergency accommodation to homeless people this winter in partnership with Newport churches.

The first night (26 Nov) got off to an excellent start, with everything going smoothly. We had a total of 14 referrals asking for emergency assistance, with 9 people accessing the shelter. Work now starts to find homes for those who we are supporting.

St Julian's Baptist Church are accommodating the homeless on Saturday nights through till the end of January 2019.

Many thanks indeed to all the volunteers, without whom it would not be possible to run the Night Shelter.

Green light for new hall at St Julian's Baptist Church

St. Julians are delighted to have been granted planning permission and funding from the Welsh Government for our new Jubilee Hall. This will replace the old Banbury building to the left of the church with a larger, multi-purpose permanent building. This will be on the same site but extending forward in line with the existing front of the church. There will be a larger main hall which can be split into two smaller ones, plus a new kitchen equipped for catering, a full range of toilet facilities (including disabled, baby changing facilities and a wet room), two smaller rooms behind the main hall, extra storage space and a small enclosed outside children's play area. There will be extra parking spaces, but we are planning to keep as much green space as possible which will continue to be used for play, and the trees which needed to be taken down will be replaced as recommended by the planning department.

Our music is a mix of the old and new. Our aim is to be led by God's Spirit – to be neither particularly contemporary nor traditional but God focused.

After the morning service we have tea and coffee so we can spend time together as a family. So please come and share the special time we call 'Church'.

Every Christmas as soon as Christmas dinner was over, my brother John and I would go over the bridge, and he would change into Father Christmas and I was his little helper.

It was wonderful, those children would have a small gift in the morning before church. But then they would give us a rendition of the nativity which they had made up themselves.

Father Christmas would then appear and hand out presents. Muller's have never asked for anything but lived by faith alone. They had a lovely life those children.

My sister still has letters and cards from most of them to this day. Also we still have Robert, who grew up in Muller's but came home as part of our family at 15 years old.

All of my Christmases have been happy because of the reason for the season, the birth of Jesus Christ. But my memories of Muller I pray will never fade.

Newport Street Pastors have been patrolling in the City Centre for the last 9 years. We have built good relationships with the public, the police, the door staff and City Council. We have had some amazing experiences as we have trusted God to lead us to people that need help or just to talk, we have waited for numerous ambulances and have had many opportunities to show the love of God to the people that are part of our city.

How can you help?

- **We need more Street Pastors!** If this is something that you would like to be involved with please contact us. We would love to take you out with us one night as an observer.
- **Night base,** We have a night base to provide refreshments to Street Pastors and Police. We need people to help in the night base while the Street Pastors are patrolling.
- **Prayer partners,** We cannot do this without God leading us and giving us wisdom to deal with the situations we face. If you could be a dedicated Prayer Partner to a Street Pastor please contact us.
- **Finance,** It costs approx. £300 to provide a new Street Pastor with training and a uniform. If you feel you are able to donate we would be really grateful.
